## YEAR IN REVIEW

I would rather not think about 2020 but I have to, we have to.

We build on our past, challenges, failures and triumphs.

2020 was a shattering year with major disruptions, changes and uncertainty.

It was a year of readjusting our plans and visions. We had so many for the year.

Every life was affected by the Covid 19 Pandemic. No one was spared.

However, in the face of uncertainty and adversity we kept trying. Artists Alliance Barbados adapted and we pushed on - Resilient. The work continues. We can proudly boast of completing 14 projects including the launch of artistsalliancebarbados.org.

We received funding to chart a new strategic path through the Jan and Peter Boos Foundation which granted us the expertise of Chris Harper. We are extremely thankful for the work he did on the Strategic Plan and especially on the accounts. We have been able to use these documents to apply for funding. A CIDF Grant is in process and we are have started the application for the Aspire Program.

Spearheaded by Norma Springer, we started workshopping with key stakeholders in the creative community to craft a strategy for greater visibility within the tourism market.

We saw the importance of Art and Culture during lockdown. Some of our participating artists created and shared as part of online communities. Artists Alliance Barbados went with the flow into virtual reality being strategically positioned with the launch of artistsalliancebarbados.org. The passion and hard work of a number of people paying off. Special Thanks to The Arts and Sports Fund for the funds to make this possible, Norma Springer's passionate vision for getting this done and the designers- Hugh Walker, Doreen Edwards and Graham Gill.

Two of our founding directors, Norma Springer and Corrie Scott, stepped back from their directorship. We are indeed grateful for all of the hard work and commitment that they have both put into building aaB. They both continue to support our endeavours. Corrie Scott continues as an allied artist and champion of the arts and Norma as a 'ordinary citizen' supporter.

Jason Hope and Hugh Walker stepped up and have been legally recorded as directors, with the skills vital to take us forward. They come with new energy and vigour. Jason Hope is the Director responsible for virtual tech. He has committed to ensuring our push into Ecommerce and paired with Hugh Walker's wealth of IT experience we are finding our niche. We are excited about making this a success.

Doreen Edwards has agreed to be a Director and we are in talks with others to help round out the vision and skills of the Board. Chris Harper has been instrumental in helping us restructure our governance model that will enable us to secure an unprecedented level of prosperity.

Our projects are quantitively less than last year, but this is to be expected. However, we were able to add an online component to all of our exhibitions coming out of the Covid 19 Pandemic lockdown.

We are extremely grateful to our hosts. Our almost permanent ones remained true to the cause even during the roughest year in 100 years. Special thanks to the Argentine Embassy of Barbados, the Norman Centre and the Grove Gallery. Our ad hoc Pop Up hosts ensures that our product offering is unique and diversifies our publics. Thank you Harrison's Cave and Gajah.

We were extremely pleased to welcome Russell Watson as Residency Coordinator for Norman Centre. We look forward to some exciting work on this platform.



Under the umbrella of Artists Alliance Barbados Oneka has curated 30 shows in the last 3 years (2016-2019) and specializes in 'Pop Up' exhibitions. These shows focus on utilizing alternative spaces with a view of diversifying art audiences and creating new markets for artists.

As owner of Core Design and Concepts she would have been instrumental in the design and implementation of the Barbados Concorde Experience and the Champions Room at the Barbados Olympic Association (2007)

She was a consultant to the National Art Gallery Committee and would have catalogued pieces within the collection in 2000/2001. She also worked as Gallery Coordinator for the Barbados Gallery of Art (1998).

Through her work she has shown her dedication to other areas of Barbadian culture and heritage working within the culinary arts and environmental heritage field. She holds a Bachelor of Design in Environmental Planning from the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design and MA in Museum and Exhibition Design from the University of Lincoln.
